## Vermont's LeadershipEducationin

Neurodevelopmental Disabilities is a training program about improving systems of care for children and youth with Autism and other neurodevelopmental disabilities such as Down syndrome, cerebral palsy, and intellectual disability.

## WHAT DOES VTLEND DO

- Trains professionals, self-advocates and family members to become leaders and change systems
- Teaches aboutneurodevelopmental disabilities, leadership, person-and family-centered care, interdisciplinary collaboration, cultural and linguistic competence, and policy and systems change.

## ACCOMPLISHMENTS

Since 1995, VT LEND has graduated:

- 193 Long Term Trainees (300+ hours)
- 341 Medium Term Trainees (40-299 hours)
- 379 Short Term Trainees (under 40 hours)

In 2018-2019 alone, VT LEND presented their work 23 times at national conferences, 35 publications and 127 trainings.
