Advocates from across the country have been working hard to get involved with the implementation of the new Home and Community-Based Services (HCBS) regulation. The new rule defines the community settings where Medicaid will fund HCBS and creates rules for person-centered planning. State advocates looking for examples to follow should look at Wisconsin's Take A Stand on the Plan website, a portal for individuals and families to learn about the rule and submit their comments on Wisconsin's plan. #### Arkansas Sees Sharpest Drop in Uninsured Rate in the Nation (AR UCEDD)

In a recent blogpost from the Arkansas Governor's Office, Gallup report released shows that Arkansas outpaced the rest of the country in reducing the rate of uninsured residents during the first six months of 2014. Arkansas's uninsured rate fell from 22.5% at the end of 2013 to 12.4% midway through 2014. "The Arkansas UCEDD invested a huge amount of time and effort in their Navigator program, educating Arkansans about their health insurance options, and ensuring that Arkansas with disabilities was included in health insurance outreach."
