Short Term Outcomes

- Increase pathways for children to be screened in conjunction with the medical home.
- Develop common protocols and policies for screening, referral, and utilization.

Medium Term Outcomes

- Increase knowledge of screening, referral, and utilization policies and procedures.

5. Shared Measurement

Use data from the 2 pilot sites to develop evidence-based processes and protocols to promote a statewide system of developmental screening.

Screening: ASQ, ASQ-SE, Vision, Hearing

Data Collection: Number of children screened, referred, and receiving services. Develop longitudinal data to monitor health and development, and document cost effectiveness of system.

Data Governance: Implement Universal Consent Form, MOAs for Data Sharing, and Universal Child Identification System.
