## 1. Special Olympics

#### Sports at the core:

- 32 Olympic-type sports
- 49,778 annual competitions
- World Games every two years
- Major Regional Games

#### Broad scope:

- Programs in 170 countries
- 3.7 million athletes
- 275,000 coaches
- 847,000 volunteers







# Special Olympics Healthy Athletes

#### A Clinical Vehicle to address Public Health Needs

- Free health screenings for athletes
- Run by health professional volunteers & students
- Clinical and didactic training for these volunteers
- Data aggregated across all events, and used to educate and inform:
  - Improved public policies
  - Expanded research and programming
  - Greater awareness about health needs

- Enhanced access to follow-up care

- Additional elements to address developing world health concerns








#### Local Level Partnership Development

- Create communities of care for athletes
- Engage local, state, provincial, and national governments and "influencers"
- Reduce dependence on SOI for funding

# Local Level Partnership Development: Examples

- Special Olympics Indonesia / Indonesia
   Dental Association support for screening, provision of follow up-care, continuing ed credit, earned media
- Special Olympics New Zealand / Donald Beasley Institute – analysis of raw data, creation of an evidence-based business case for policy and funding purposes







#### Enhanced Access to Follow-up Care

- Establish linkages between the screening event and community care providers.
- Engage and educate additional health professionals and students

- Mission of Mercy (United States)
- Hear the World Foundation/Phonak





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## Integration of Health Throughout SO

- Families education program
- Young Athletes
- Athlete Leadership Programs (ALPs)
- Sports (Fitness Programming)
- Coaches training

Key lessons: ensuring support of key leaders, inclusion in SOI Strategic Plan, couching health agenda as one of "enhancing sports performance."



# Integration of Health Throughout SO **Examples**

TRAIN (Testing Recreational Activities & Improving Nutrition)

- Sport-specific readiness assessment
- Sport-specific conditioning programming
- Sports nutrition and hydration education

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# New Programming for Developing World Health Concerns

- Adapt and augment screening programs to cover a broader range of health concerns
- Engage with a range of global health and international development organizations (government, NGO, foundation) to adapt existing materials for our athletes.
- Ensure that programming translates and is readily adopted in a range of settings.

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# 3. Updates from Athens, Greece 2011 World Summer Games

- 3751 athletes screened
- New Clinical Directors trained from 23 countries
- Hundreds of Greek health professionals trained



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# Updates from Athens, Greece 2011 World Summer Games

- Pilot of hand washing module
- Nearly 200 athletes to be fit with hearing aids under remote access model through Phonak distribution network
- Demonstration of new cell-phone project for direct data entry and interactive text messaging followup with athletes post-event.








# Updates from Athens, Greece

# 2011 World Summer Games

- Signing of partnership agreement between SOI and UNICEF for global and local-level collaboration.
- Discussions with UNICEF, European Commission, Heads of State, Ambassadors, UNESCO, Health Ministers, Corporate leaders, Media, Sports Federations, Celebrity athletes






