Developing Leaders

1. Recruitment of self-advocates
2. Support (e.g. advocacy/self-advocacy faculty, coaching, technology access)
3. Accessibility of materials/curriculum (e.g. tools, strategies, personnel needed)
4. Cohort development (i.e. peer connection) – *how do we ensure that self-advocates have meaningful, reciprocal relationships and roles within the trainee cohort?*
5. Professional skill development (e.g. presenting information with confidence, networking, time management)
6. Next steps/opportunities (e.g. career path, community supports and connections)

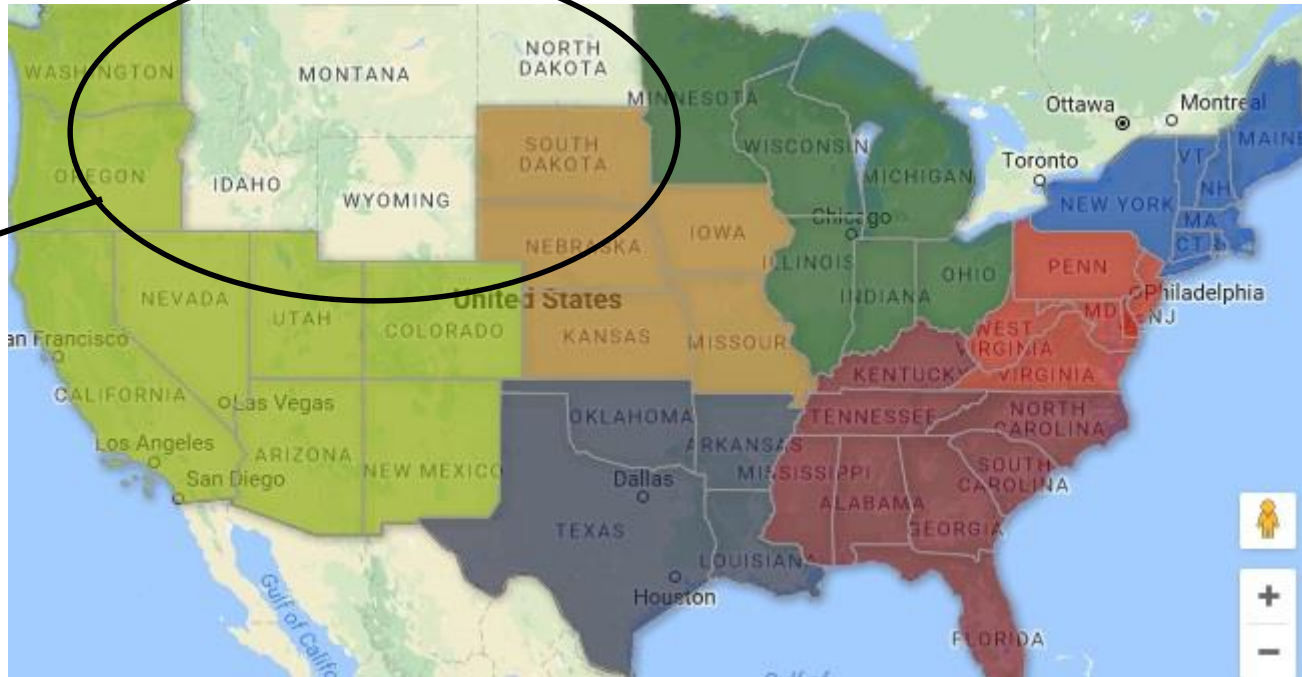
