The seminar is designed for currently practicing Deaf Family Educators to acquire an understanding of the role and functions of mentorship following the linguistic and cultural model, as well as foster a network of education and training support to these Deaf Family Educators who will provide mentoring services to deaf/hard of hearing children and their families in the home, community, and education settings. The seminar provides opportunities for these Deaf Family Educators to discuss a working model of bilingual language acquisition (American Sign Language and English), and to create a multicultural community where deaf, hard of hearing and hearing people learn, play, and work together cohesively. In addition, Deaf Family Educators acquire a basic working knowledge of Part C and Part B of the IDEA regulations essential to their role and functions as professionals of the Early Intervention and Deaf Education teams.
