MCH Training Program

The MCH Training Program seeks to train the next generation of leaders who will provide or assure the provision of quality services for the MCH population.

Quality services for mothers, children and adolescents require professionals who are:

- Attuned to the special needs of children, adolescents and children with special health care needs;
- Trained to provide or assure the provision of interdisciplinary, family-centered, and culturally competent services;
- Focused on improving the health of the entire population

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1961: Panel on Mental Retardation

Background

A 25 person Panel on Mental Retardation was appointed by President Kennedy on October 11, 1961. Composed of scientists, educators, and other interested individuals, the panel's function was to examine the causes of mental retardation. Eunice Kennedy Shriver was instrumental in the establishment of this panel, development of research and programs for mentally retarded, and founder of the Special Olympics in 1968.

Impact

A report of their findings was submitted in October, 1962. The report contained 112 recommendations that concerned research, preventive health measures, clinical and social services, facilities for employment, and



1893: First State Program for Children with Handicaps

- **Minnesota was the first state to provide a state program children with handicaps.**
- **By the end of the 19th century, hospitals for children with orthopedic handicaps had been established in many major cities.**

Change led by families

- General Federation of Women's Clubs (est. 1890)

Julie Beckett represents the thousands of parents who turn personal challenges into public results. Her success is an inspiration. She:

- Took her case to the Reagan White House and won new national policy
- Co-founded a nationwide grassroots organization for other parents

- Family Voices (est. 1990)

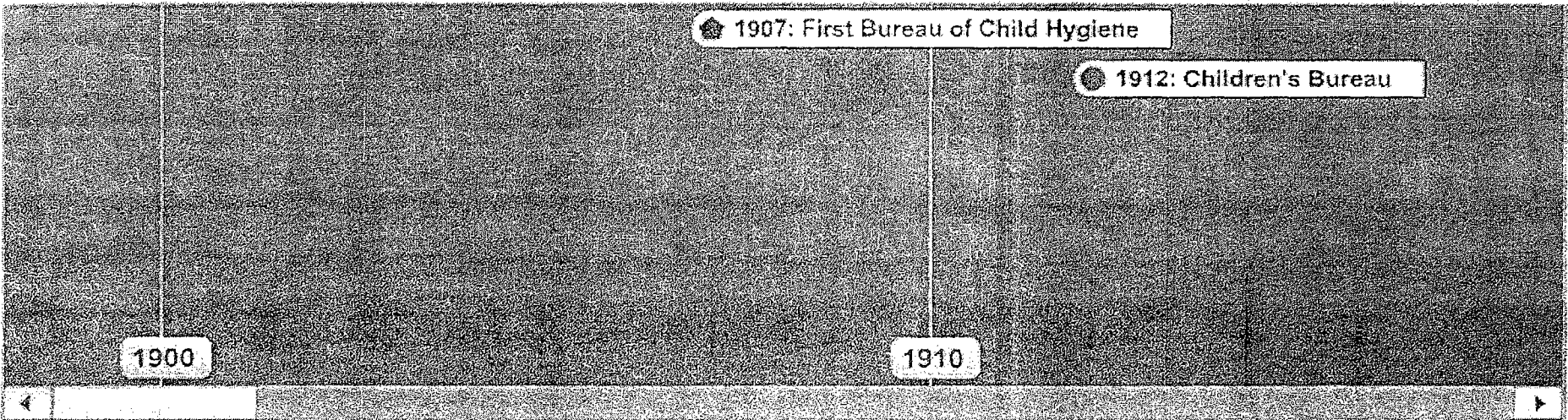

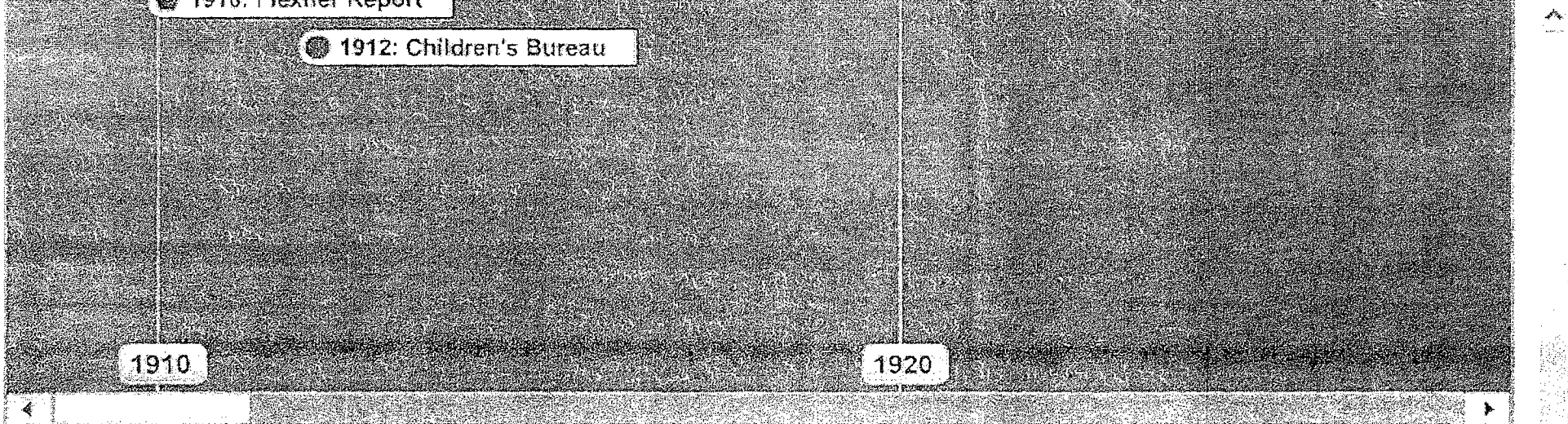

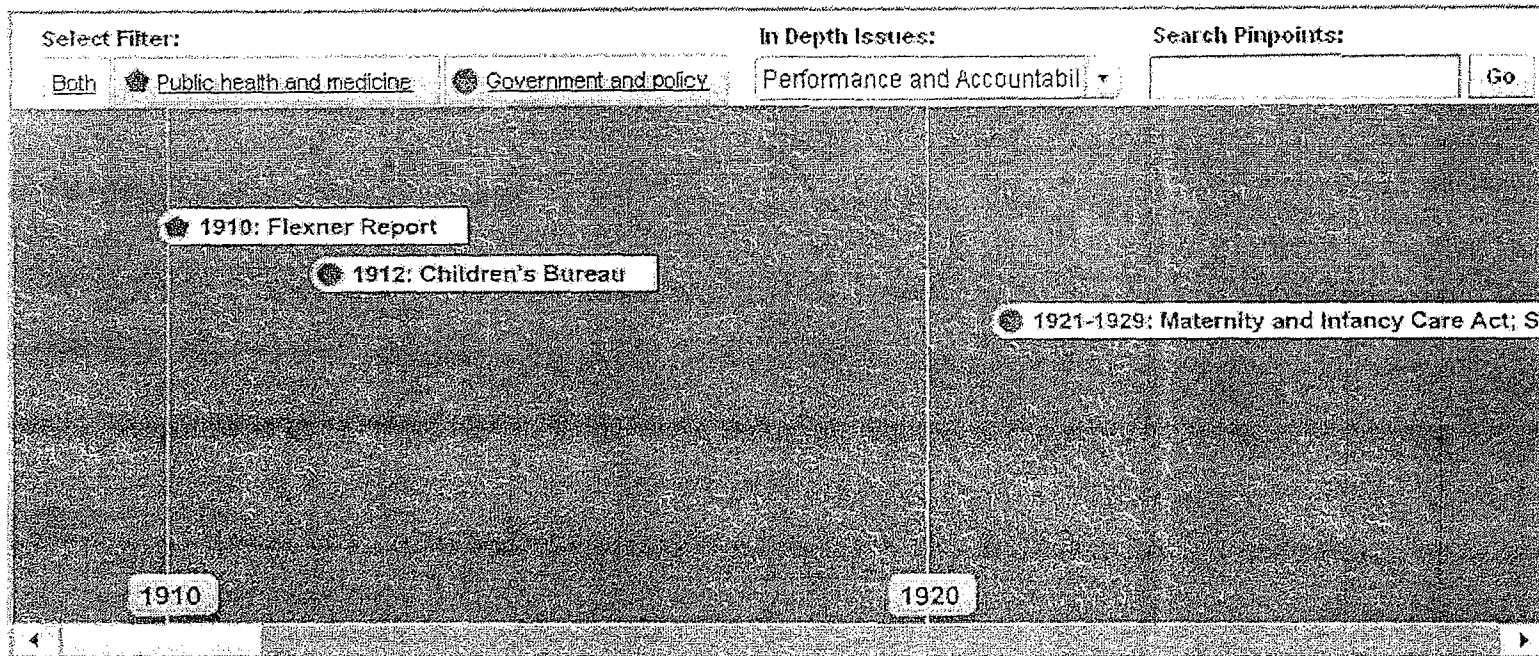

History of LEND

Early 1950's

Children's Bureau supported four demonstration projects for Interdisciplinary (ID) clinical services

1957

States developed diagnostic and education clinics (D & E)

History of LEND, cont'd

1960

Children's Bureau provided grants to institutions of higher learning for ID training for children with mental retardation

1963

First UAF established

History of LEND, cont'd

1980's and 1990's

Focus became more on prevention of developmental disabilities

1987

UAF's became UAP's

1994

MCCHB changed the name to LEND

Purposes of the Training

- Providing leadership training in an interdisciplinary setting
- Providing knowledge and skills in a clinical setting
- Focusing on Title V working with the MCH programs and communities in the states

Purposes of the Training, cont'd

- Promoting cultural competence
- Promoting a family centered approach to care, and
- Promoting diversity in recruitment and retention for both trainees and faculty
