

#### Missouri at a Glance

- The Division of Mental Retardation, Developmental Disabilities is responsible for ensuring prevention, evaluation, and habilitation services for people with developmental disabilities. Autism is specifically named in eligibility statutes and regulations.
- Other key access points include Elementary and Secondary Education (First Steps, Parents as Teachers, Head Start), Health and Senior Services (Special Health Care Needs), local county boards created by Senate Bill 40, Missouri Autism Projects, and the Missouri Autism Centers of Excellence.

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- Transition from birth to 3 services
- Transition from early childhood
- Transition from high school to meaningful employment or meaningful day
- Transition to adult services, including residential services

  Coordination between home, school, programs and treatment

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# **Ongoing Challenges**

- Continuing collaboration at the individual, local and state level
- Balancing diagnostic, assessment and evaluative services with direct services offered in the home, school or community
- Developing standards and services that are responsive, cost-effective, evidence-based and non-duplicative
- Continuing the present momentum with sufficient human and financial capital
