

COVID-19 Vaccine



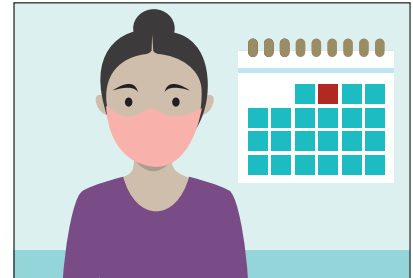

Now, there are vaccine shots that put medicine in your body. The medicine protects you from COVID-19.



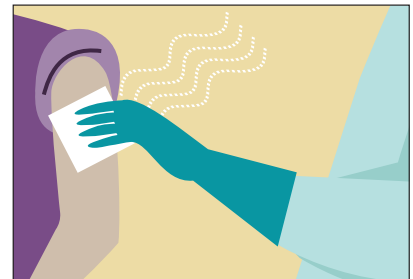
When it's my turn, I can get my shot to stay healthy.

I will sit very still, and then feel the shot. It will feel like a pinch or a prick.



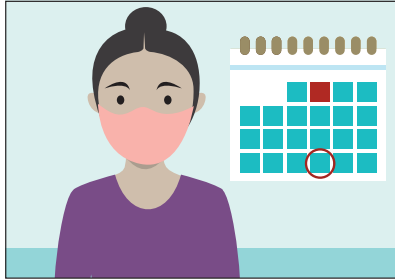
Then I will get a bandage on my arm.



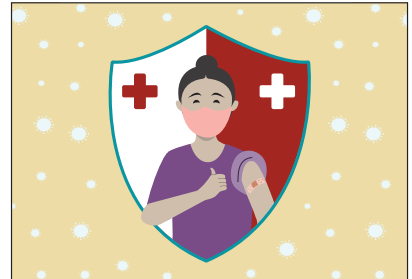
The doctor or nurse might ask you to sit and wait a little bit before you go home. They want you to be okay.



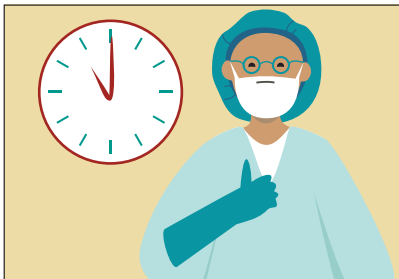
They will tell you if you need another shot to stay healthy.



You might need to come back in 3 or 4 weeks for a second shot, and . . .



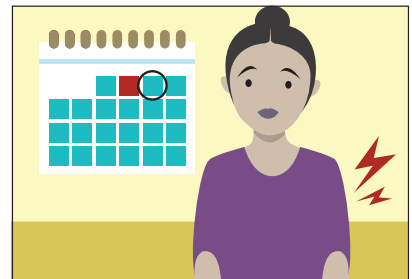
You will go through the same steps with the second shot.



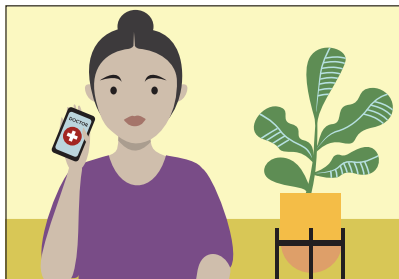
When they tell me I am okay, I go home.



I might have a red spot from the shot. My arm might be sore. I might feel tired, have a headache or fever.



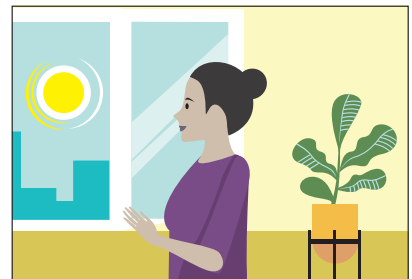
After a day, if my arm is still red and sore, and I still feel sick. . .



I can call my doctor.



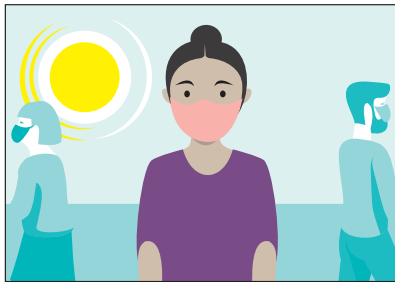
Or I can call the COVID-19 Call Center, 1-866-779-6121, and press 3 for help.



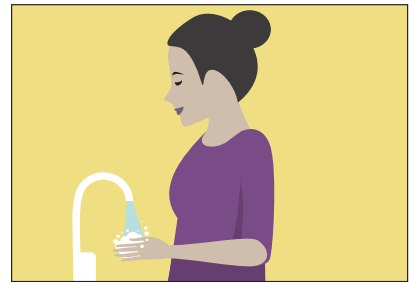
After a couple of days, I will feel fine.
