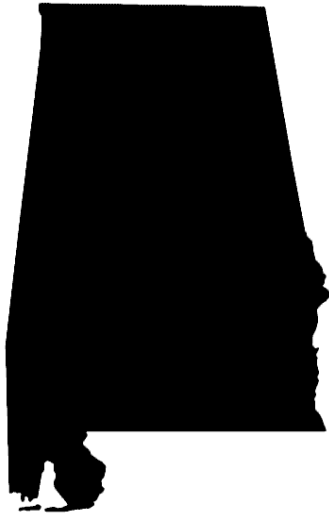


AUCD Centers Serving Alabama
