- 1. Zero Reject
- 2. Free Appropriate Public Education
- 3. Least Restrictive Environment
- 4. Individualized Education Program (IEP)
- 5. Civil Rights Framework
- 6. Key Role of Parents
- 7. Investment in a high quality multidisciplinary workforce



WITH DISABILITIES

EHA/IDEA Reauthorizations

- 1983- Transition services R&D parent training & information Centers
- 1986- Services for preschoolers statewide early intervention for infants
- 1990- Renamed IDEA Mandated transition services defined AT devices & services added autism & traumatic brain injury



EHA/IDEA Reauthorizations cont.

1997- Access to general education curriculum Participation in statewide assessments Transition planning at age 14 Mediation services Disciplinary procedures Establishing performance goals Regular report cards



EHA/IDEA Reauthorizations cont.

2004- Early intervening services Highly qualified special education teachers Stronger enforcement Stronger transition planning Alternate Assessments Identification of LD no longer requires discrepancy Paperwork reduction initiatives Research moved from OSEP to IES Link to ESEA through NCLB



Accomplishments in 35 Years

- •Full access to education
- •Increased inclusion in general education
- •Increased graduation rate
- Increased employment
- •Increased postsecondary participation

- •Quick fix preparation routes and poor professional development that results in poor instruction for students with disabilities
- •Not enough employment and postsecondary participation
- •Too many parents struggling
- •Insufficient support for services for children 0-5

The Vision

- •Students with disabilities are general education students first
- •Parents are respected and essential
- •System focuses on teaching & learning, not labels and compliance
- •All students college & career ready
- •New roles for special educators
- •Systemic preparation & professional development that is data driven, research based, ongoing, & integrated for general & special education

•Students with disabilities purposefully addressed & included in all school reform initiatives
