- (1) characteristics of persons with intellectual disabilities (including autism) and mental health problems;
- (2) maladaptive behavior or other comorbid disorders;
- (3) risk and protective factors related to the development and/or prevention of mental health problems in persons with intellectual disabilities;
- (4) development of screening and diagnostic instruments, and;
- (5) the effectiveness of behavioral, psychosocial and pharmacological treatment procedures (including group and single subject designs).
- (6) Critical or comparative literature reviews, including quantitative meta-analyses and occasional conceptual reviews that provide for new understanding of theory or theoretical constructs will also be considered.

All submissions will be subject to peer review and rigorous scholarship is expected.
