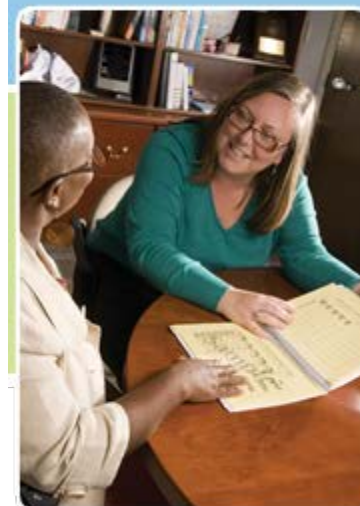
Act Early Ambassador Project

 - Goal to develop a network of state-level experts to improve early identification practices



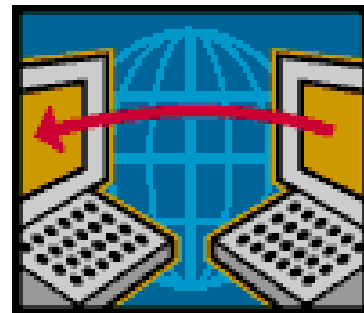
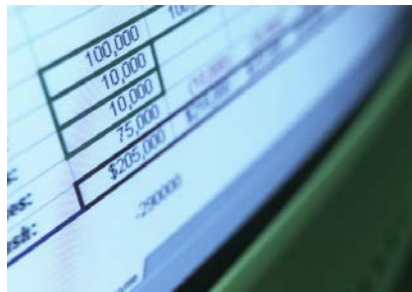
Including People with Disabilities – Public Health Workforce Competencies

Disability and Health Program Impact Project 4

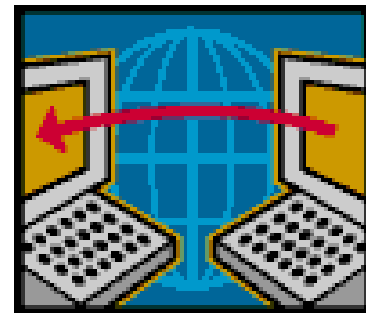
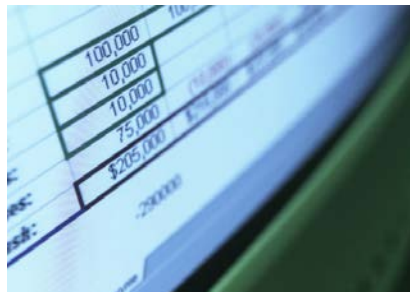
- AUCD is a technical assistance partner

 - Test of the data analysis template developed by South Carolina
 - Build capacity for surveillance and services for people with a disability

- Therapy before medication in youth with ADHD = CDC Winnable Battle
- Kennedy UCEDD in Bronx is lead content developer
- Developing training videos
 - Goal: give behavioral therapy basic training to parents and early child care professionals in a video series
 - Expected summer 2016

- University of Oklahoma
 - Positive parenting evaluation project with an evidence-based curriculum
 - Testing group-based intervention approach with Spanish-speaking community
 - Wrapping up in summer 2016

 - Can internet panels be effective to collect data on different disabilities and health status
