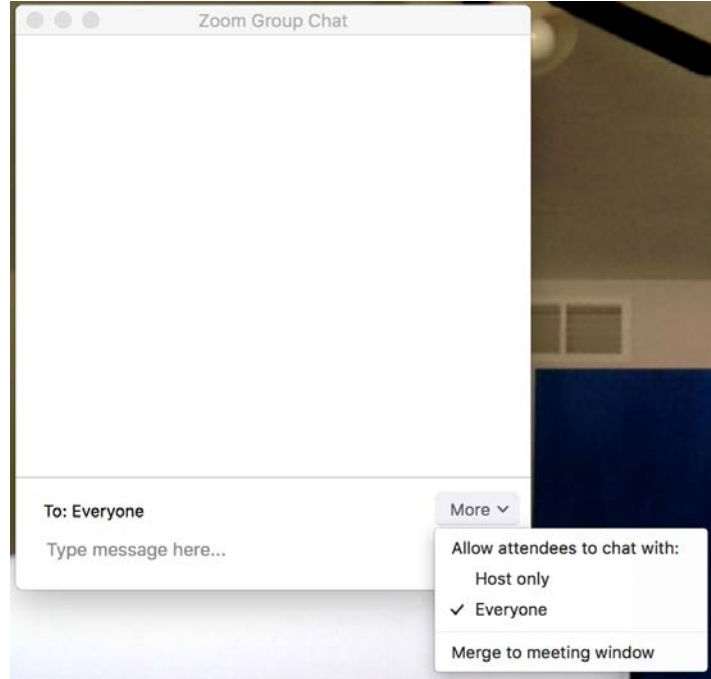

Vocabulary



- Relationship (relationship status)-this defines whether you are in a sexual romantic relationship or not and if you are in a relationship, what type of relationship.
- Friends with benefits-some people are in a sexual relationship, but are just friends. The couple doesn't do other things like date or live together as a couple.
- Married-this is when a couple decides to marry. It is a legal commitment and can be between a man and a woman, two women, or two men. It is legal in all states to marry someone of the same sex as you.
- Partnered-this is a couple who has been together for a while, but are not married.

Vocabulary



- Dating-this is when two people are getting to know one another and enjoy being together. They may not see themselves as a couple, but going on dates with one another like the movies or dinner dates.
- Single-this is when a person is not in any of these other types of relationships. Some people who are single want to stay single and some people who are single are looking for someone to date or become a couple with.
- Monogamous relationship-the two people have decided to only be sexual with or date each other.
- Polyamorous relationship or an open relationship-the two people have decided they have the option to be sexual with or date other people
