Early childhood vision screening and treatment can prevent permanent vision loss, learning difficulties, and delayed sensory, motor, cognitive or socialemotional development.





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- Coordinate and engage key stakeholders through an in –person vision summit to initiate program activities, followed up with monthly teleconferences.
- Develop and pilot vision screening protocol based on national recommendations and guidance from Wyoming Pediatric Task Force to be implemented in early childhood settings to include:
- Ensure active follow-up and surveillance for children not passing vision screening.
- Continuous evaluation of community need related to screening and program effectiveness.
- Host regular webinars to ensure community outreach and education related to essential elements of a statewide vision system.
- Create a formal training program and infrastructure for vision screener Create and disseminate community education messaging.
- Incentivize essential elements through early childhood education credits (STARs) and contact hours.

- Align with national and state initiatives and priorities
- Leverage the experts
- Assess and respond to community need related to essential elements **Engage families**
- Mobilize key stakeholders
- Reflect and be flexible based on feedback
- Be persistent
