Development of Online Caseworker Resource Regarding Children with Disabilities

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Background


Developmental Disability and Child Welfare:

- Developmental Disability (DD) is inconsistently tracked within child welfare.
- 28% 50% of youth are estimated to have a diagnosis of DD.
- Children with DD are:
 - o In foster care for longer periods of time.
 - o Less likely to be reunified with their birth parents.
 - O At greater risk for mental health care needs.
- Prior LEND projects have determined that:
 - O Caseworkers report having difficulty referring and accessing disability specific services.
 - O Caseworkers identify a need for professional training and additional knowledge to appropriately case plan for children with DD.

Best Practices in Online Training:

- Online training shown to be as, or more, effective than traditional learning.
- Use of user-controlled multi-media resources such as pause and playback functionality.
- Immediate corrective feedback in quizzes and exercises.
- Clearly defined learning objectives, presented to the user.
- Shorter module lengths = increased user compliance with trainings.

Objectives




Methods

- Best practice literature review to create an online training tool.
- Created content for Online Training Toolkit.
- Developed detailed script for voiceover and activity narrative within tool.
- Merged content, voiceovers, & activities into finished Online
 Training Tool using Adobe Captivate software for animations.
- Invited Westchester County Department of Social Service (DSS) caseworkers to complete the training.
- Compiled feedback to further revise training tool content.

Community Partner

- Former foster care youth led organization
- Themes Identified:
 - o Difficulty accessing education services.
 - Limited social supports.
 - Multiple changes with caseworkers.
 - o Eligibility concerns.
 - Limited connections to community resources.
 - Lack of services upon aging out of foster care.



Results

- Successfully created an Online Training Tool through Adobe Captivate utilizing best practices in online teaching, and content from research about DD.
- Training estimated to take 1 hour to complete, via five, 10 minute modules.
- Training included features such as multiple choice quizzing, matching, and open ended questions with immediate feedback.

Discussion

- This project was able to successfully create a prototype online training tool to help address the disparity between caseworker education on DD, and the rates at which they service clients with DD.
- Follow up with caseworker feedback may bring changes in the tool to best support caseworker learning and needs.
- Next steps include: presenting tool to caseworkers, and assessing the impact of training on outcomes for those with DD in the child welfare system.
