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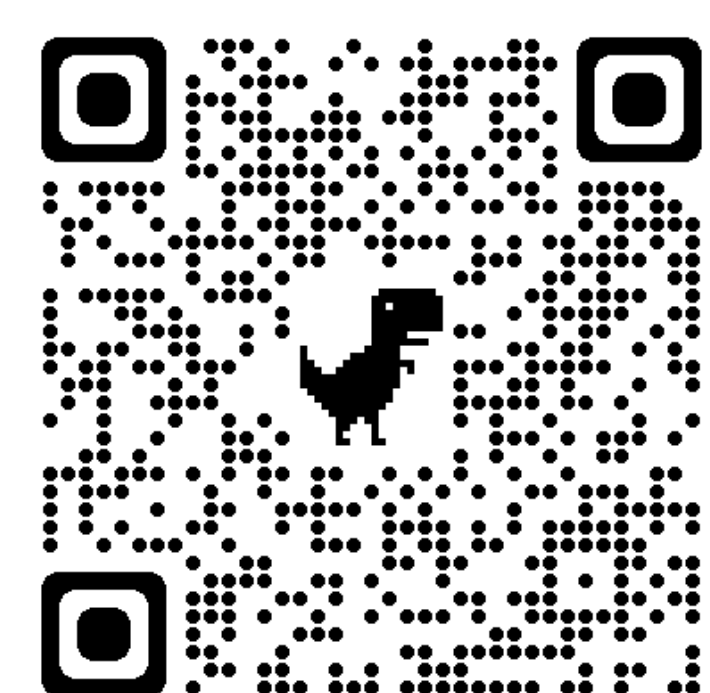

Implementation

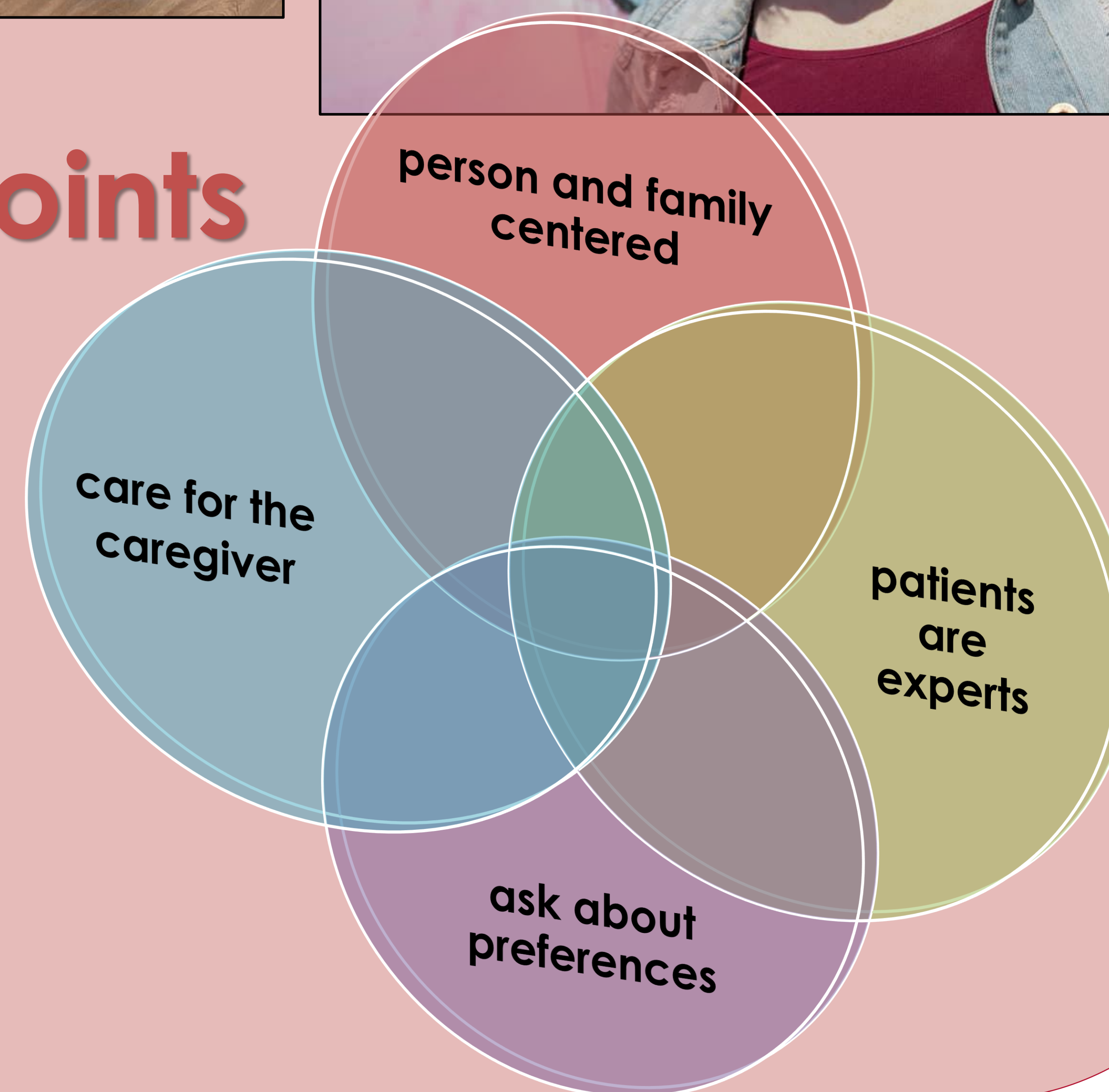
Education module shared with medical-surgical nurses in a suburban hospital.
