Medicaid is a Lifeline for People with Disabilities

- Covers vital healthcare and long-term services for over 1 in 5 Americans, including children and adults with disabilities.
- Provides support like help with bathing, dressing, employment, and living independently through Home and Community-Based Services (HCBS) and Long-Term Services and Supports (LTSS).
- **Keeps people in their homes and communities**, avoiding costly and isolating institutional care.

Supports Health Systems, Families, and Rural Communities

- Main funder of rural hospitals and primary payer for births in rural areas.
- Caregivers depend on Medicaid for their own coverage while caring for loved ones.
- Cuts to Medicaid harm family caregivers, force job losses, and strain the healthcare workforce.

Efficient, Cost-Effective, and Flexible

- Medicaid costs less per person than private insurance or Medicare.
- Offers **state flexibility** to customize services and respond to crises (like COVID-19 or lead exposure).
- Supports thousands of customized services for people with developmental disabilities.

Capped Funding Puts People at Risk

- Per capita caps and block grants shift costs to states and families, leading to service cuts, longer waitlists, and forced institutionalization.
- 710,000+ people are already on HCBS waitlists—caps would make this worse.
- Work requirements and exemptions are harmful, complex, and ineffective—many with disabilities would lose coverage.

Medicaid Drives Innovation and Future Success

- Provides **early intervention** for children, improving health, education, and lifelong outcomes.
- Invests in employment supports, mental health services, and cutting-edge technology.
- Covers 38 million children and over 40% of births nationwide, ensuring a healthy start for families.

Plain Language

- Covers important healthcare and supports for people with disabilities to live in the community.
- Funding caps, block grants, and work requirements will all cause people with disabilities to lose coverage.
- Medicaid is an extremely important program that does a lot of different things to support people with disabilities, children, older people, and caregivers.
