Approach

AIR-P maintains an interdisciplinary, multicenter research network for scientific collaboration and infrastructure to increase the life expectancy and quality of life for autistic individuals, with a focus on underserved/vulnerable populations. AIR-P advances intervention studies focused on autistic individuals across the lifespan by:

Disseminating research findings



Research Scholars & Pilot and Feasibility Funding Program

Provides funding and mentorship for independent investigators at all career stages

- Annual RFP for 4–10 awards ranging from \$10k–\$50k
- Supports preliminary research and data collection to help secure external funding
- Transdisciplinary collaboration encouraged
- CRE faculty may have opportunity to serve as mentors to Scholars




